

**Community Foundation of Greater Flint
Scholarships to Benefit Genesee County Students**

High School Students

- **Bob Emerson Scholarship Fund - \$1,000 awards**

To provide scholarship support to residents of Genesee County who are attending an institution of post-secondary education; are maintaining a 3.0 GPA; and who are active in civic and/or political community affairs (Gift Language). To be awarded to residents of Genesee County who are a current or past nominee of the Priority Children's Outstanding Youth Award. Candidate must be a high school senior or currently enrolled in post-secondary education. Candidate must be able to document involvement in community service. Ninth through 11th grade students will become eligible to apply during their senior year of high school, or once enrolled in post-secondary education. Documentation of continued service to the community will be required. An essay and two letters of recommendation required.

The deadline to apply for this scholarship is January 20. Apply online at cfgf.org.

- **Brad Stone Achievement Award Fund - \$6,000 award**

To be awarded to an active or previous player with the Eastern Michigan Hockey Association (E.M.H.A.), having played two winter seasons with E.M.H.A. and must qualify for the Academic Award Banquet by receiving a 3.0 or above for the first semester of the school year. The scholarships will provide support for tuition to an accredited college or university. (Gift Language) Player must turn in application and will be considered based on academic performance, extra-curricular activities, community service, two letters of recommendation and personal essay.

- **Eastern Michigan Hockey Association - Bob Landaal Scholarship - \$1,000-\$4,000 awards**

To be awarded to high school seniors and college students who participate in the Eastern Michigan Hockey Association programs, and who demonstrate academic performance and financial need. Letters of recommendation and an essay are required.

The deadline to apply for these scholarships is February 23. Apply online at cfgf.org.

- **Leslie G. Ames Fund - \$1,000-\$2,000 awards**

To be awarded to graduating seniors of any high school within Genesee County with at least a 3.0 GPA. Equal consideration should be given to Genesee County and City of Flint students, and need as well as ability shall determine deserving recipients. Support will be provided for tuition, books and/or fees at an accredited higher education institution for a 4-year degree program.

- **J. B. Cook and George Carpenter Scholarship Fund - \$400 award**

To be awarded to a male and female who are graduating seniors of a Genesee County, MI school, with a GPA of 2.0 or higher and who have lettered in tennis. Scholarship funding is limited to support for tuition, fees, and books.

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- **Flint Area Education Foundation General Scholarship Endowment Fund**

To be awarded to an African-American graduating senior high school student of Genesee County attending a college, university, or technical school, or students with a 2.5 GPA or better. ACT/SAT scores, community service, financial need are considered. Two references and a description of future goals are required.

- **Clinton B. Jones Fund of the Flint Area Education Foundation**

To be awarded to an African American graduating senior high school student of Genesee County attending the University of Michigan-Flint. Students must have a 2.5 GPA or better. ACT/SAT scores, community service, financial need are considered. Two references and a description of future goals are required.

- **LeVert and Nina Jones Fund of the Flint Area Education Foundation**

To support scholarships for African-American graduating senior high school students of Genesee County who have been adversely affected by substance abuse attending a college, university, or technical school. Student must demonstrate financial need.

- **Marie Manley Scholarship - \$4,000 awards paid over four years**

To be awarded to a female high school student enrolled and graduating from any Flint or Genesee County High School and who participated in the Flint Olympian and CANUSA Games (Gift Language) during any one of their four years in high school. Students will list school and community activities, and briefly describe their experience as a participant in the Flint Olympian and the CANSUA Games. A scholarship will be awarded over a four-year period, renewable each year, providing the recipient maintains acceptable grade standards (2.5 GPA; for schools who do not use grade point a C+ average will be required). At least three candidates will be interviewed. Each scholarship recipient will receive: \$1,000 per year for 4 years.

- **Howard S. Staisil Scholarship Fund - \$1,000 award**

To be awarded to a participant in the CANUSA Games (Gift Language), a community-wide (City of Flint - Genesee County) competition. Students must have participated in the Flint Olympian and CANUSA Games during any one of their four years in high school. The recipient must be a graduating senior or in college, have a minimum GPA of 2.5 in high school, description of experience as a participant in the Flint Olympian and CANUSA games and one letter of recommendation.

- **American Institutes of Architects-Flint Scholarship Fund - \$1,000-\$2,000 awards**

The AIA Flint Donald. E. Lee Architecture Scholarship will be awarded annually based on available funds and per the recommendation of the Advisory Committee. Scholarship Applicant Criteria:

- Student will have received or anticipate receiving their high school diploma from a high school in the geographic area, or base residence be in the area represented by the AIA

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Flint, a Section of the American Institute of Architects, of Genesee, Shiawassee and Lapeer counties in Michigan. Students that fall outside of this geographic area may be considered should other eligible applications not be selected.

- Student must be newly accepted or currently enrolled in a program with an associate degree in architectural technology, an NAAB accredited architecture program at a university or college or be in a pre-architecture program and declare architecture as their primary course of study.
- Student must not be a recipient of an AIA-Flint Architecture Scholarship in the immediate previous year.

The scholarship may be used for college related expenses. Payment will be made by the Community Foundation of Greater Flint directly to the educational institution attended by the applicant. Recipients will be notified and announced in June.
